

1. This is the final concord made in the court of the lord king at Westminster from the day of St. Michael into the 15 days in the 20th year of the reign of Ed
2. ward son of King Edward before Hervey of Stanton John of Mutford William of Herle John of Stonor and
3. John of Bousser justiciars and others the faithful of the lord King then there present Between John son of Thomas of Otryngton plaintiff and Adam
4. son of Nicholas of The Lound and Isabella his wife defendants concerning two messuages and one carucate of land with appurtenances in Thorn-
5. –ton in the Strete. Whence a plea of contract was to be maintained between them in the same court Namely that the aforesaid Adam and Isabella recognised
6. the aforesaid tenements with appurtenances to be the Right of John himself As that which the same John has as a gift of the aforesaid Adam and Isabella Having and
7. holding to the same John and his heirs from the chief lords of that fee for service, which appertain to the aforesaid tenements in perpetuity. And besides the same
8. Adam and Isabella granted for them and the heirs of Isabella herself that they themselves will guarantee to the aforesaid John and his heirs the aforesaid tenements with
9. appurtenances against all men in perpetuity And for this recognizance Guarantee fine and concord the same John gave to the aforesaid Adam and Isabella
10. twenty pounds sterling.
