2. William heron esquire and William Laverok yeoman, all my lands tenements rents and services that I have in the town and territory of Thornton in
3. the Strete and also my one messuage in North Allerton in the county of York with its appurtenances having and holding all lands and tenements rents
4. and services and the aforesaid messuage with its appurtenances to the aforementioned John, Stephen, William and William their heirs and assigns, from the chief lords of those fees by
5. services thence owed by right accustomed in perpetuity. In testimony of this matter I affixed my seal with these witnesses
6. John Conyers James Strangvisse knights, Robert Danby sergeant at law Christopher Conyers Roger Lasell esquires and others
7. Dated at Thornton in the Strete 4th day of November in the twenty-sixth year of the reign of King Henry VIth after the Conquest of England.

3. Laverok yeoman full and peaceful possession and seisin of, and in all my lands and tenements, rents and services which I have in
4. the town and territory of Thornton in the Strete and also my one messuage in North Allerton in the county of York with its appurtenances having
5. and holding all lands and tenements rents and services and the aforesaid messuage with its appurtenances to the aforementioned John, Stephen, William and William their heirs
6. and assigns in perpetuity according to the strength form and effect of my certain charter thence to them made confirmed and approved having and to be having whatsoever
7. my aforesaid attorney will have made or will have caused to be made in these premises or any of the premises just as I myself might be able to do in the same place if I
8. were personally present. In testimony of which matter I attached my seal to these presents dated the 4th day of November in the 26th year of the reign of King Henry the sixth after the
9. Conquest of England.
